### Packington Playground Opening



## New Play Facilities opened by local MP



It's been a very successful term at Packington and certainly a very active one. First we were delighted to be awarded the Basic Skills Quality Mark and receive a certificate and plaque to display in the school and a logo to put on our letterhead.

The mark is granted to schools that show they have strategies in place to improve the basic skills of pupils. The school has also been presented with a plaque from Derby University for the excellent work we do in mentoring and supporting student teachers. Finally, we were also very proud to hear that we have been placed in the top 50 of all state small schools in the country, according to the Sunday Times who compiled the list based on the percentage of level 4's attained over the last 3 years.


Bible Society





Christmas is fast approaching, with shops geared up for Christmas sales. The shops are ready and no doubt the thieves and robbers in our community are also ready for what they hope will be a seasonal bonanza. Please follow the following brief tips to ensure that they do not spoil your festive season.

1. When you are out shopping always keep your purse or wallet in a safe place and, lady readers, if possible please wear your handbag around your neck with the clasp against your front and keep your hand on the top. There will undoubtedly be pickpockets at work in the Christmas shopping crowds. Don't make it easy for them by having a wallet in a back pocket or a purse on top of a shopping basket.







### Parish Council News

The village pump on Measham Road has recently been refurbished and it is now in full working order. Work is still required on the surrounding masonry which the council hopes to undertake next year.

At present the Council are looking at setting their budget for next year, which will set the Parish Council tax for the next financial year. As soon as the budget is finalised, it will be published on the Council's web page

(www.packingtonpc.org.uk) and in the next edition of the Packington Post.

The traffic group working party is still in negotiation regarding a traffic calming scheme which would be acceptable to LCC Highways and next week have a meeting with the County Councillor, Nick Rushton. We are hopeful that all parishioners will soon be able to see revised plans and be able to give their views and comments prior to any work being undertaken.

Two new initiatives have been launched by the County Council:1.A web site for young people "www.thejitty.com." This site is run by young people, for young people and is recommended by LCC as a responsible site that may be of interest.

2. The other site is www.lsora.org. which is an online research atlas with statistical data from a number of sources.

The County Council have made changes to the timing of the mobile library service in the village. It now only stops on High Street, but for an extended period. The Parish Council have asked questions about what service is to be provided for elderly and infirm residents who are now unable to use this service. Their response is still awaited.

Another facility that has just been launched on Nottingham East Midlands web site is "Web Track". This facility shows detailed routes for the flights in and around the airport up to 15000 ft. To find this site go to

"www.nottinghamema.com" and

click on the "Web Track" link in the left hand corner.

Some time ago village organisations kindly donated to a fund to provide a memorial to Sue Wiggett's memory and the decision has now been taken to provide a seat in the new play area. This will be in place shortly and will have a suitably inscribed plaque. Rev. David Haywood will dedicate the seat in the New Year and we hope that members of Sue's family, together with parishioners, will be able to attend.

The Council meet every month on the second Tuesday at 8.00 pm and everyone is very welcome to attend.

#### WI November



## Growing Plants Over The Winter



If you have a windowsill and still want to grow plants over winter, then take a big cardboard box and cut it into a frame – like an awning with its full depth at the back and dropping back to a 4" deep tray at the front. Cover the inside back and side surfaces with kitchen tinfoil.

Set into the box your pots or seed trays of lettuce, spring onions, cherry tomatoes and annual herbs, keep moist and do not over water. Place the box on your windowsill. A south or west-facing view - is the best, but your box will maximise light from any direction.

At worse, just prop a white painted board or white card behind any plants you grow on your windowsill – any time in the year. It does make a big difference.

### National Vegetable Society Recipe.

Drunken Chestnuts. Ingredients: 3lb Sweet Chestnuts Dry Red Wine [half pint] 2oz Granulated Sugar

Preheat the oven to 180C [gas mark 5] Make a slit in the rounded side if each chestnut and arrange them in a baking tray and bake for 30 minutes. Remove from oven and allow them to cool for 5 minutes. Remove the shells and inner skin while they are still warm. Combine the wine and sugar in a saucepan over a low heat - stirring until the sugar has dissolved. Add the chestnuts and cook until the wine is reduced to a thick syrup [probably 30 minutes]. Place the mixture in a shallow dish and serve with a sweet desert wine! Contact Paul Parry 412918

### 2006 CWUHA Humanitarian Aid Convoy



Mother and Baby Centre in Chernigiv, Ukraine

Our convoy started on 8th September leaving Packington with my co-driver Stuart and heading for Newcastle where we met up with the rest of the convoy on a Post Office lorry park ready to take the overnight ferry to "ljmuiden" in Holland.

The crossing was good and we landed at 10am. After sorting ourselves out we headed for Amsterdam then on through Germany to Cottbus on the Polish border. Then, on through Poland towards "Chelm" on the Ukrainian border which was achieved in three days of hard driving and with everyone keeping together. We were met at the Ukraine border by an interpreter who was also a staff member of "Every Child". With her help, paperwork and the lorries were checked and sealed. The next morning we set off for Kiev which was a six-hour drive. We parked our lorries in a secure compound and were taken to where we were staying for the next few days.

Next morning we went back to collect our vehicles and get clearance from local customs so that three of the lorries could continue to "Cernihiv" which is north of Kiev. After a seven-hour drive we were taken to a local hotel, basic but clean.

The following day we returned again to our lorries and waited for paper clearance and lorry checks by yet another set of Customs which took nearly all day.
Next morning we set off for our destination - the "Mother and Baby Unit" in "Cernihiv". Twelve months ago this was a run-down building but with Aid taken in April 2006 there was a great

improvement in the conditions. The

people in charge and the mothers were delighted to see us arrive and were overwhelmed by the Aid we had brought.

Some of the children gathered round to see what we were doing, one or two stood back not knowing what was going on, but a few sweets and toys handed out here and there, and the children seemed happy.

We were also taken to an HIV centre situated in two rooms in a run-down building situated next to a bus park. Everyone from the area congregate at this point and so it is an ideal position to offer help as some of our specialist aid was specifically for this unit.

All too soon we were on our way home, everyone felt good at what

home, everyone felt good at what we had yet again achieved. This had been a trouble free journey and we all arrived home tired but happy.

Of course this would not be possible without your help and we cannot find words to express what your support means, not just to us, but mainly for the children who benefit from your generosity.
