• "And lead us not into temptation but deliver us from evil": you know how often we want to do just what we want to do and forget you and disregard others, help us to follow you and your way.

Packington Parish Council

Chris Miles, Chairman of Packington Parish Council called the Annual Parish Meeting which took place on Thursday 18th April at 7pm.

The Annual Parish Meeting was an ideal opportunity for residents to find out more about HS2 and Councillors had leafleted all households in the village to encourage attendance. Around 50 to 60 residents were able to view full-sized drawings of the proposed route and the meeting was used to gauge opinion. County Councillor, Nick Rushton and District Councillor, Nigel Smith attended and answered many of the questions raised.

The meeting was opened with a brief resume of Parish Council activity over the previous twelve months and unaudited accounts up to 31st March 2013 were on display. Questions on issues other than HS2 were taken initially and it was clear that dog fouling was a topic that concerns many residents. The Parish Council will therefore make this an agenda item for the next meeting. In addition, the matter of restricted visibility for drivers leaving Homecroft Drive was raised and this matter will also be discussed in Mav.

The meeting then moved on to the matter of HS2. Councillors advised residents of information such the proposed route, proposed stations, regularity of trains and the potential impact that this will have on Packington.

An HS2 meeting had taken place at County Hall earlier that day which Nick Rushton had chaired. Chris Miles and Vice-Chairman, Ian Dring had attended. A question and answer session ensued when many concerns were raised. It is Cllr Nick Rushton's feeling that HS2 will go ahead and therefore it would be in Packington's interest to oppose it but to work with HS2 Limited to request amelioration measures in order to minimise the impact on the village.

After the discussions had ended, a vote was taken and residents opted to oppose HS2 but to look towards amelioration measures. A vote was also carried that some of the precept monies would be spent on gaining a professional opinion and report on ways to minimise the impact on Packington which could then be submitted at the appropriate time.

HS2 will remain on the agenda for some time to come and any resident is welcome to attend the Parish Council's monthly meetings to ask questions on

this issue or any other matter of concern.
