

Further to the account of wheelchair access from Measham Rd to High St in the previous Packington Post, I can report that the official route recommended by LCC Highways for wheelchairs is via Mill St and Little Lane! As most of you know the deadline for the HS2 Environmental response was the 21st of December. The Council submitted a thorough document stressing that accessibility and quality of life of Packington residents should not be put at risk by the building phase of HS2. The Resident's Action group with whom the Parish Council liaised, also submitted an impressive document. The Council wishes to thank them for all their hard work.

Crime in November was reported as one burglary in Mill St where forced entry and jewellery was taken. The Council urge everyone to be vigilant and report any suspicious behaviour by phoning 101 Most planning applications are given approval by the Parish Council but two applications were objected to in the December meeting. One on Ashby Rd and the other in the middle of Normanton Rd and High St. Reasons for the objections can be found in the minutes of the meeting on the Parish Web site. The Parish Precept and its Budget has been discussed and resolved. There are no increases in the Parish rate which parishioners Pay annually. We also know that NWLDC do not propose an increase but LCC have increase their annual amount by just over 3%.

Improvements to the Recreation ground were discussed and money has been set aside to fund some of the improvements which are mentioned in the Recreation Ground report. Work to improve the appearance of Little Lane and Mill St were also discussed and accepted. For more details of Parish Councils decisions and notices please go to our website.

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MAKE A CHANGE..... BECOME A LOCAL COUNCILLOR

Packington Parish Council is calling on residents, passionate about their community to stand in the local elections in 2019.

What do councillors do?

Councillors are the champions of their community and give residents a voice on the decisions the council makes.

Becoming a councillor will allow you to make a real difference in your community by engaging with residents, local groups and businesses to find out their needs; making decisions on which services and projects the council should take forward; and getting involved locally to ensure the services are meeting your community's needs.

How long does it take?

The National Association of Local Councils (NALC) Local Councillor Census Survey found that councillors put aside, on average, three hours a week for council work. This often includes attending meetings, engaging with residents and speaking on behalf of the council to other bodies.

Can I stand?

There are only a few rules to stand for election. You must be: British citizen, or a citizen of the Commonwealth, or the European Union 18 years of age or older Live in an area that is served by a local council

How can I get involved?

It has been another busy few months for Officers of the Memorial Hall. Since August the central heating boiler has been acting up and whilst it did work well when switched on, it would randomly switch itself off! Despite spending nearly £500 pounds on spare parts and labour to get it working it was eventually decided to replace the boiler. The replacement was installed on the 5th January and it is hoped that we will have a reliable heating system for a good number of years.

The Memorial Hall's AGM will take place in March when a new Management Committee will be formed. The Memorial Hall has been very lucky over many years to secure the voluntary support of individuals who have given their time in order to manage this well used community facility. We would encourage anyone who is able to help or is interested in the welfare of this facility to come to the AGM. Without this voluntary support the Memorial Hall would cease to function.

At the time of writing this report I know that the Committee will be requiring a Meeting Secretary, so if you are able to help in this regard please come along and volunteer.

The Hall has offered to hire their own tablecloths to users for a number of years. However, this service is on hold until we find a person willing to wash them after use. If you can help in this regard, please contact the Chairman. There is a remuneration for this work of $\pounds4.00$ per tablecloth.

In my last report it was noted that the Playschool had unfortunately had to finish. I am pleased to report that many of the gaps left in the daytime hours of the Memorial Hall have now been filled. We have some keep fit groups for the elderly and some pregnant Mums and Tots groups as well.

Financially the Hall is doing well and it is hoped that a good team of volunteers will be elected to continue the good work for

Recreation Ground Charity

The new apparatus on the Recreation Ground continues to be a great success. The footfall of children and families using the park has increased tremendously so far this winter and the new rides and swings have proved very popular.

The Trustees have approved extra work on the Recreation Ground. The carpark will again be levelled and top dressed and a hardcore, gated roadway from the carpark to the top level of the field will be made. This will enable better vehicle access to the field when it is deemed necessary. Work repairing the swing security gate at the entrance will also be undertaken. Profits from the Bonfire and a grant application from the Community Fund will help finance these projects. Trustees may have to close the carpark for a day or so to allow this work to be carried out. Notices will be placed at the entrance when final dates for this work is known.

The original lock to the Container on the Recreation Ground is no longer in use. The replacement is already in place and as the container was set up to be accessible for all, anyone wishing to become a designated keyholder, should apply to the Secretary to the Trustees.

History Group

At our final meeting for 2018, we were joined by Wendy Freer of Pudding Bag Productions, a group based in Ashby which produces film and drama documentaries on historical themes. Wendy and colleagues are working on a film project about Rev. Thomas Pestell, who succeeded his father (also named Thomas) as Vicar of Packington in 1644 during the Civil War between King Charles I and Parliament. A year or so later he was ejected by a Puritan preacher and accused of various misdemeanours, for which he appeared before Parliamentary Commissioners in Leicester. In 1651 he was present at the Battle of Worcester and narrowly avoided being hanged after Oliver Cromwell defeated the Royalist forces there. He returned as Packington's vicar in 1662, after the restoration of King Charles II, and continued until he died in 1690. Wendy told us that she hopes some of the filming will take place in Packington and there may be opportunities for local people to observe a "shoot" or to appear as an extra in the film. We will be keeping in touch with this project as it develops through 2019.

Our Annual General Meeting will take place on **Tuesday 29**th **January** at 7.30 p.m. in the Memorial Hall Meeting Room. We are keen to recruit new members, so anyone who has an interest in history, particularly concerning the village and the surrounding area, will be very welcome to join us. After the formal part of the meeting we will have a wider discussion to plan the group's activities for 2019.

At our February meeting (Tuesday 26th February, same time and place) we will welcome Paula Dring who will talk to us about Rev. Joseph Goadby, who was a leading figure in the former Baptist Chapel in the village. The Chapel was in Mill Street halfway down on the left.

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We will be pleased to welcome any nonmembers who would like to hear about him at this meeting.
