# **Preserving Packington's Past**

# Packington Village History Group needs your help!

Members of the PVHG are undertaking their most ambitious project to date – a survey to establish and map the date of construction of **all the existing** properties in Packington as of 2024, and they need your help.



We don't know when the first inhabitants of Packington arrived (not surprisingly none of their original dwellings remain!) but, to quote the late Peter Cooper, one of the founders of Packington Village History Group:

"Packington started life as an Anglo-Saxon village - the 'tun' (farmstead or settlement) of Pacca. This may have been in the 7th or 8th century when many Anglo-Saxon villages were formed, but the first historical references to Packington come in the 11<sup>th</sup> century.

"In 1043 AD the "village" of Packington was given to the new Abbey of Coventry and it remained in their hands until the dissolution of the monasteries in Henry VIII's reign 1509-1547 when it then came into the hands of the Hastings family."

Most of the "Hastings Estate" properties were sold off by auction in the 1920s. The last item to go was the Round House which passed to the Parish Council in 1997.

Many current Packington residential properties stand on the site of former agricultural landholdings such as farms and small holdings, or other properties such as previous dwelling houses, church buildings, post offices, smithies, shops, or even pubs! Each new property development has brought additional people with more skills and vibrancy into our village.

# **Packington Traffic Calming Group**

A PTCG meeting was held at the Memorial Hall on 16<sup>th</sup> November and was attended by Lead Councillor Nick Rushton, LCC's Traffic and Signals Team Manager, District Councillor Nigel Smith, two Parish Councillors, and John, the school crossing patrol officer. Unfortunately, a representative from Leicestershire Police was unable to attend.

PTCG Chairman, Jonathan Alexander, gave a presentation highlighting the problem the village has with regards to excessive traffic speed. The presentation and full article can be viewed by scanning the code below.



On Saturday 25<sup>th</sup> November residents may have noticed the police presence on Measham Road. In half an hour there were 6 vehicles out of a total of 81 vehicles passing by which were travelling above the prosecution threshold.

We understand there were further speed checks carried out by the police in Packington on 23<sup>rd</sup> December although the precise location and number of prosecutions for our village is not yet known.

# New Year Honours List Names Former Packington Resident

Chris Bryant, whose family have lived in the village since 1985, has been awarded an MBE in recognition for his 'Services to Sport'.



Chris grew up in Packington until he moved to Manchester to study Business Management at university. After graduating, he joined Deloitte Consulting where he was seconded to the 2012 London Olympic and Paralympic Games. Following this, he moved across to deliver the 2015 Rugby World Cup before he joined the Football Association (FA) based at Wembley, where he has been for the last eight years.

As Director of Tournaments and Events for the FA, Chris has led a number of projects, including Tottenham Hotspur's Premier League residency, NFL, EURO 2020, Women's EURO 2022 and the recent 2028 UK and Ireland EURO bid.

Chris told the Packington Post: "I have always loved sport and consider working in the industry a great privilege. I feel both honoured and grateful for this award. I am very proud and thankful to all my colleagues, friends and most of all my family."

Chris will be invited for his Investiture at Buckingham Palace in 2024 (date TBC).

Our village cafe has been awarded Best Cafeteria in Ashby by Restaurant Guru.



# Packington Village History Group Continued from page 1

It is probably no coincidence that the Packington carnivals started in the 1970s shortly after the building of many affordable new village properties in the late 1960s. These were soon filled with young married couples, some already with children. The opening of the A42/M42 making our village commutable to Birmingham and Nottingham brought more growth and a new wave of arrivals.

Packington currently contains nearly 400 properties. Recent expansion is likely to continue in the foreseeable future.

In order to map the growth of Packington, and record the history of our village at the start of this new Carolean era, Packington Village History Group (PVHG) proposes to try and establish the date of construction (as accurately as possible) of **all the existing** properties in Packington.

Packington Village History Group would welcome help from the current owners and residents of property in Packington to assist in this survey. We realise that many current owners may have extended or significantly altered their properties since they were acquired but, in this survey, we are simply trying to plot the current individual dwellings in our village and establish the date in which they were initially constructed. If you know

the date, or the year, in which your property was built we would be very glad to hear from you. We understand that a property on Mill Street has a date (in the early 1700s) stamped somewhere on its interior which is a wonderful clue to the date of its origin.

Please do help us with our survey of village property construction dates and tell us when your home was built by using the quick form on the History Group's website at pvhg.uk or by scanning the QR code below.

We hope to publish the results annotating a street map of the village in the near future.







#### To use:


- open the camera on your smartphone or tablet and point it at the code
